# **ANNUAL NCC REPORT 2022-23**

Combined Annual Training Camps are mandatory for all the NCC cadets to appear for B and C exam at the end of academic year. If the performance of the cadets in the training camps are good they will be selected for many other training camps like Tal Sainik Camps, Adventure camps like, Trekking camps, Rock climbing camps, Pre Republic Day camps, Local Independence Day camps, Army attached camps SSB Camps and so on. All these training camps will go on for 10 to 12 days depending as per the instructions of the NCC directorate and the type of camp. Ministry of Defence looks after the NCC with the help of State Directorates. Every NCC state Directorates has certain NCC Group Headquarters and 5 to 7 NCC Battalions are grouped under this and the instructions are passed from the NCC Group to the Battalions and the same is passed to the Institutions and the activities are conducted. We have provided certificates of the cadets who have attended the camps. Certificates are not provided for Yoga Day Celebrations, Rallies, Tree plantation, Conducting Awareness programs, Blood Donation, Poster making and other activities conducted.

The following were the Camps, Programs, Rallies, National Celebrations and Exams taken up by NCC cadets and ANO in the academic year 2022 -2023.

#### **COMBINED ANNUAL TRAINNING CAMP - I**

Combined Annual Training Camp – I was conducted in NCC Nagar, Tirupati from **18-05-2022 TO 27-05-2022**. A total of 50 Vacancies were allotted to our college and **50** cadets attended the camp along with ANO Lt. Dr.C. Kalapriya. This camp is compulsory for all the cadets every year. These camps are held within the state under the aegis of respective NCC Directorates. The duration of this camp is usually held for 8 days. The basic aim of Camp is to introduce cadets to a regimented way of life and helps in developing camaraderie, team work, leadership qualities, self-confidence, self-reliance and dignity of labor in the cadets. The cadets are exposed to the excitement of camp life where they apply the theoretical knowledge that they had gained in Institutional Training. It is mandatory for Junior Division/ Junior Wing cadets to attend at least one camp and Senior Division/ Senior Wing cadets to attend a minimum of two camps during the period of their enrolment. Cadets are trained in firing, foot drill , map reading, weapon drill, classes on personality development , health and hygiene and self defense

techniques are taught. Our Company Bravo stood first in the parade competitions held in the camp. Also other cadets participated in cultural programme and have won prizes.

# **POKHRAN II CELEBRATION DAY**

# 13-05-2023

Pokhran Day is celebrated in India on **May 11th** every year. It commemorates the successful nuclear test carried out by India on May 11, 1998, in Pokhran, Rajasthan. The test, code-named Operation Shakti, made India the sixth country in the world to possess nuclear technology.

The Pokhran tests of 1998 consisted of five nuclear tests of advanced weapon designs. The first three tests were conducted simultaneously on May 11 and the other two detonations took place on May 13.

The Pokhran tests had profound implications for India's national security. By establishing itself as a nuclear power, India sent a clear message that it possessed the capabilities to defend its sovereignty against potential threats. 10 NCC cadets participated in poster making presentations and 15 cadets participated in the essay writing competitions held in our college.
