AWARENESS TRAINING ON COVID FOR NCC CADETS (I GOT certificate)

26-04-2020

To take care of the training needs of the frontline workers, the Government of India has launched a training module for management of COVID-19 named 'Integrated Govt. Online training' (iGOT) portal on Ministry of HRD's DIKSHA platform for the capacity building of frontline workers to handle the pandemic efficiently. Courses on iGOT have been launched for Doctors, Nurses, Paramedics, Hygiene Workers, Technicians, Auxiliary Nursing Midwives (ANMs), State Government Officers, Civil Defence Officers, Various Police Organisations, National Cadet Corps (NCC), Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKS), National Service Scheme, Indian Red Cross Society, Bharat Scouts and Guides and other volunteers. The training contents of the course include Basics of COVID, clinical management, ICU care management, infection prevention and care, usage of PPE, quarantine and isolation, training for NCC cadets, management of COVID- 19 cases, laboratory sample collection and testing, psychological care of patients, paediatric care in COVID, pregnancy during COVID, etc. The new learning content is being regularly added to the modules. Our College NCC cadets have taken part in this plat form and 100 cadets have received iGOT certificates.



SURVEY AND AWARENESS OF COVID IN RURAL AREAS 30-05-2020

07 NCC cadets of our college belonged to rural areas and they planned to conduct a survey and awareness on COVID- 19 in rural areas. The cadets explained the importance of social distancing, wearing of face mask, use of sanitizer and the way of hand washing to the rural people and cleared their doubts.

Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan or Self-reliant India campaign is the vision of new India envisaged by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. On 12 May 2020, our PM raised a clarion call to the nation giving a kick start to the Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan (Selfreliant India campaign) and announced the Special economic and comprehensive package of India's GDP – to fight COVID-19 pandemic in India.

The aim is to make the country and its citizens independent and self-reliant in all senses. He further outlined five pillars of Aatma Nirbhar Bharat – Economy, Infrastructure, System, Vibrant Demography and Demand. 50 Cadets took a pledge and participated in the program and received certificates. Poster presentations were made by cadets.





B AND C EXAMINATION CADRES 15.02.2021 TO 19.02.2021

The B and C Exam cadres were conducted in our college campus from **15.02.2021** to **19.02.2021** for five days. It is mandatory for NCC cadets to undergo a Combined Annual Training Camp every year to attend the B and C certificate examination to be held in the month of March every year. But due to COVID 19 the CATC camp was not conducted instead Cadre was held. For this three PI staff were detailed to our college. The program was addressed with Principals remarks on 15.02.2021 in Virtual class room. Principal Sir instructed all the cadets to make use of this opportunity for five days and learn drill and theory classes from the staff.



Drill classes were conducted in the parade ground. Cadets were taught general and words of command, sizing, forming, numbering, open and close order march and dressing.





DRILL BY CADETS

Objectives of NCC were explained, organisation of civil defence and duties were taught to the cadets. Introduction of Map reading was done for the cadets and Field craft and Battle craft was taught to the cadets. In this cadets were allowed to Judge Distance, hand signals and field signals were shown to the cadets. The cadets were made to stand in different section formations for better understanding like single Line, diamond, double line, spearhead, arrowhead and extended line formations.



Conduct of theory classes to cadets

B and C cadets were trained in saluting at halt, getting of parade, dismissing and falling out of the parade was taught.

Cadets were taught on assistance during natural and other calamities like flood, cyclone, earthquake, accidents etc., Brief history of Indian Army war heroes like Field Marshal Sam HormusjiFarmjiJamshedjiManekshaw, Field Marshal KodanderaMadappaCarriappa OBE Major Somnath Sharma, PVC, Major Shaitan Singh PVC.

Introduction of weapon training with .22 Rifles MK - IV and its parts were explained by using charts and posters. The different positions of firing, loading of magazine were taught to the cadets.

The Commanding officer of 5 (A) Girls Bn, NCC unit visited our college. The cadets were provided with five 7.62mm SLR rifles to give hands on training to learn weapon drill for C cadets on salami shastr, Bhumi shastr, Bagalshastr and Bhajusastr. B and C Cadets were trained in Kholna and Jodna of the weapon and learnt their parts. CO Sir interacted with the cadets and explained the importance of NCC to cadets. 30 C cadets received B passed certificates by our Principal and Commanding officer.

B EXAM CERTIFICATES WERE DISTRIBUTED TO THE CADETS

Cadets were told to give their views about cadre and NCC activities. Classes on fire service and fire fighting were taught. Leadership qualities and styles were explained to the cadets. Apart from this Pollution control on water, air, soil and Noise were discussed.

Parade training on Samne se tezchal, Aagemur, Baenmur, Pichhemur, Dahinemur, Dahine, Baen, Samne salute, halt with arms, Kadamtal, Daudkarkadamtal, Baenghoom, Dahineghoom were taught.

Map reading included use of maps, types of maps, cardinal points, finding own position, types of ground, conventional signs, Types of bearing and use of service protractor, use of prismatic compass and their parts were explained to the cadets.





Class on Health and hygiene, personal care, nutritive diet and proper sanitation were discussed.





Cadets were trained well in practical syllabus and theory classes for B and C exam for this academic year.
